prevent the development of mental health problems in children Signs and symptoms of mental health problems can be evident very early in life, although, before the ages of 3 or 4 years, risk factors for mental health problems and mental disorders, rather than actual manifestations of disorder, are more likely to be evident

development, Erik Erikson presented a model emphasizing the challenges and tasks presented across one's lifespan as key to understanding human development Further, unlike Freud, Erickson emphasized development from within a social context Erickson's theory is an epigenetic theory, which means it focuses on both the biological and genetic

Principles of life-span development Paul Baltes (1987) has articulated a set of principles which guide the study of human development within a life-span framework Baltes argues that these principles form a family of beliefs which specify a coherent view of the nature of development It is the application of these beliefs as a coordinated whole
